


I am really impressed with how the P/1 students help one another in the classroom. They've shown patience and understanding when working in pairs and small groups, during math & fine motor lessons.

Class end of term celebration 4/5/6 classroom:


Well done to the 4/5/6 class for their excellent work this term. I have been impressed with the efforts of the class as a whole to learn and refine new skills.



WHY IS CORE STRENGTH IMPORTANT FOR MY CHILD?

Think about a tree. It has a strong trunk, allowing it to hold its branches, or limbs, into the air and to bolster it against the wind and rain.

A human's core is like a tree's trunk. It is what allows us to sit unsupported, stand, and to use our legs and arms effectively. A weak core means we will struggle to sit and stand unsupported, to have good fine motor control for handwriting, or eating and to be successful in moving our body in sports. We may slump when sitting, lack energy, and find it challenging to play on playground equipment such as the swing, slide and climbing frame.

Our core is made up of muscles deep within the abdomen, back and some of the pelvis.

WHAT CAN I DO TO SUPPORT MY CHILD'S CORE STRENGTH?

Good news, there is lots you can do to build your child's core strength.


- ✓ Make an obstacle course together, include jumping, crawling under tables and chairs, navigating over unstable surfaces such as cushions or cuddly toys.
- ✓Wheelbarrow races.
- Encourage playing on playground equipment, propelling self on the swing, climbing up the slide, monkey bars and poles.
- ✓Have a friendly competition, who can hold a superman pose or plank for the longest and try to build up over time.

✓Incorporate different animal walks into your daily activities.


