
While bbqing, scootering, watching Monster Truck Jam, eating ice cream and building sandcastles at the beach were our favourite activities.






2/3 Classroom



Welcome to Term 3!

2/3 have had an excellent start back to school. All students have settled very well back into our classroom routines and have adjusted to any new changes this term. The last few weeks we have been completing a range of assessment tasks to determine where students are at and the learning areas we need to target in 2/3. All students in 2/3 have shown an amazing attitude towards this and have put in 100% effort into all tasks.

In literacy this term students will be focusing on developing their comprehension skills specifically questioning, inferring and making connections. Throughout writing students will be exploring explanation texts and learning about volcanoes. This week students completed a science experiment and made volcanoes. Together we created chemical reactions using vinegar and bicarb soda, when combined these released a pyroclastic flow just like a volcano. A pyroclastic flow moves very fast and is extremely dangerous, whilst lava flows more slowly and aren't much of a threat.

In maths this term students will be learning about number patterns and developing their skills in determining number patterns.

In Week 5 on Tuesday 13th and Wednesday 14th we will be holding parent teacher interview. This is a great opportunity for parents to discuss how their child is going in their learning. Further information will be provided closer to the date. If you have any concerns and wish to discuss anything, please don't hesitate to contact us in person or via email.

This week we will be celebrating science week. Students will be taking part in a range of science activities to celebrate. Keep a look out for more information to come.

4/5/6 Classroom



Welcome back everyone! It has been great to see everyone again and I am excited for the term we have ahead of us! Our class has lots of interesting and engaging topics to explore this term. Our current focus in morphology lessons which involves the exploration of various prefixes and suffixes. Additionally, we have introduced the novel 'The Witches' by Roald Dahl in our reading sessions, which has been well-received by the students.

In writing, we are looking at explanation writing and have been focusing on the explanation structure and using sequencing words.

Furthermore, our math lessons are centered around the topic of 'location and transformation', where we are studying compass directions and the visual changes that occur when shapes are rotated, slid, or flipped.

There are a few reminders for the upcoming term:

- Parent-teacher interviews will be held in week 5 of this term, so if you would like to book an interview, then please do so through compass or catch me at the school gates and I can book you in.
- It is expected that students are engaging in home reading and documenting their readings in their reading diaries. The number of students who have been showing me their diaries has decreased over the last term. It would be greatly appreciated if all students can resume bringing them in.

• A number of students have been leaving their glasses at home, and it would significantly benefit them to have these at school, especially during reading lessons.







On Monday 15th students took part in NAIDOC Week themed activities. Together we explored a range of text written by indigenous authors and illustrators. We explored how artists use symbols and art to tell their story. Together students completed an activity that involved them creating a handprint that told their story of who they are. Each student and staff's handprint telling their story has been added to a collaborative art piece which can be found in the office area. Smile Squad is on the way to our school!

All children deserve a healthy smile, and the Smile Squad is coming to Welshpool and District Primary School to help make sure this happens.

Smile Squad is a Victorian Government program that provides free dental care to all Victorian government primary and secondary school students.

The friendly Smile Squad dental team will visit Welshpool and District Primary School later in Term 3 to conduct a free annual dental health examination for every student and provide free follow up treatment as needed.

What do you need to do?

We need your consent before we can provide services. Consent is usually provided by a parent or guardian.

Although the engagement of parents/guardians is encouraged, in Victoria, students who are considered 'mature minors' may provide consent for their own dental care. To be considered a mature minor, the Smile Squad clinician must be satisfied that the student has sufficient understanding of the risks, benefits, and possible complications of their condition and proposed treatment to give informed consent.

The Smile Squad team will check the student's teeth and mouth and show them how to keep their teeth healthy and strong. They will also provide any preventive services you have consented for. If the student needs more treatment, the Smile Squad will discuss this and seek consent.

Please complete and submit the consent form by Friday 16th August 2024 to make sure your child/children can be seen.

Paper copies of the consent form are available. Please contact the school office if you would like to request one.

The electronic consent form can be translated into more than 100 languages, and the paper form is available in 13 languages.

Do I need to attend my child's appointment?

No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.

Who is Smile Squad?

The bright orange Smile Squad vans are staffed by experienced oral health therapists, dental therapists, dental assistants and dentists. They all have lots of experience treating children and a passion for improving their oral health – for life.


